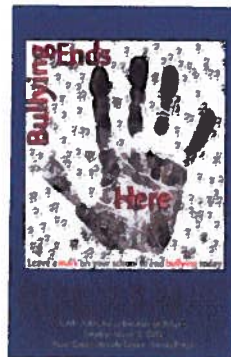
Recognition – Center for Women &

The Trumbull Board of Education convened in the Long Hill Administration Building for a Regular Meeting.

Agenda Item I – Preliminary Business

- A. Salute to the Flag - The Public Session began at 7:11 p.m. followed by a salute to the Flag. Vice Chairperson, Deborah Herbst, served as acting chair for the meeting.
- B. Recognitions – The Trumbull High Orchestra, under the direction of Justin Elkins, played several selections in honor of “Music in the Schools” month, the classical piece, *Songs My Mother Taught Me*, and a pop song, *Don’t Stop Believing*. The Madison and Hillcrest Middle School MathCounts Club members were recognized for their outstanding performance in the regional level of MathCounts program/competition which promotes enthusiasm for students to engage in critical thinking and mathematical problem-solving skills. Under the advisorship of Hillcrest Teacher Malathi Muralidharan and Madison Teacher Elizabeth Giamportone, students recognized include: David Bian, Nick Marachenko, Anubhav Dhar, Anush Sureshbabu, Jacob Fried, Aravind Sureshbabu; Eliza Khokha, Shravan Wadhwa, Cillian Donahue, Ishan Negi, Mason Freund, Jessica Oki, Lalith Gannovaram, Shreyas Srinivasan, Erica Im, Anirudh Vegiraju, Maxym Kargin, Amulya Vykunta. Both the orchestra and MathCounts students introduced themselves to the Board and public and stated briefly their involvement with the programs.

At this time, it was moved (Seaman) seconded (Chory) to take the following agenda items out of order— V-B followed by V-A. Vote: Unanimous in favor.

Agenda Item V – New Business (out of order)

- B. THS Activity Review and Recognition—Superintendent Iassogna conveyed the importance of extracurricular academic clubs at Trumbull High School in a student’s education. Dr. Tremaglio conveyed that Trumbull High School offers a wide variety of ancillary programs and activities available to its student population and noted the number of students participating in clubs totals over 1400 students over the course of a given year. He and various advisors highlighted several academic activities. “We the People” involves 24 students who won the State Championship and will compete on the national level in Washington, D.C. in April. Advisor Katie Boland and several students reviewed their experience with the program, noting their love of history, the focus on current events,

and their pride in representing Trumbull at the national competition. Model UN involves 45 students who have competed throughout the year within the State and outside of Connecticut. Advisor Katie Boland conveyed that club members replicate the positions of the actual United Nations body and have to prepare extensively in order to participate in conversations regarding a full range of international areas. They have achieved at a high level, even hosting the fall conference this year, and were the only public school in the state to receive awards at the prestigious Yale competition. Several students noted that their involvement with Model UN affords them an opportunity to practice public speaking and debating skills and has been a life changing experience, giving them an understanding of world issues and how different cultures respond to problems. Mock Trial involves 36 students who use their training in the “Justice and Law” course to apply their knowledge in competitions throughout the State. Advisor Eric August conveyed that the sessions are rigorous, preparation requires mock trials to be conducted, and these events have taken advantage of local attorneys volunteering their time at town facilities. The team finished 3rd in the State which was their highest finish ever, and in the process, they defeated the current State champions. Several students conveyed their enthusiasm for the subject matter, the building of confidence in themselves, and that they are considering a career in law as a result of participating in Mock Trial. Advisors Colin Neenan and Dean Pelligra shared that the Academic Decathlon, a ten-event contest that is a multidisciplinary (mathematics, science, literature, essay, art, music, speech, economics) overview on the topic of empire and imperialism, involves 29 students of various ability levels who took first place in the State competition. As a result of their win, six members of the team have been invited to the national competition in Albuquerque, New Mexico from April 26-28, 2012 where they will compete for the national crown against teams from 43 other states and international schools. Teacher Jodi Netting, along with Felicia Holohan, Stephanie Jalowiec, Jennifer Pacelli, Colin Neenan, and Dean Pelligra, reviewed the Freshman Foundations course which was developed to assist with the State’s newly adopted Common Core State Standards. All 9th grade students take this course involving lessons in citation, technology, and research/literacy for one quarter of the school year. She conveyed that reinforcement comes from Reading teachers, the Writing Specialist, the Technology expert, and the Library-Media staff. A handout was given to the Board, and it was noted that preliminary results and survey feedback support the fact that this has not only been well received, but also has solidified student skill sets in the described areas. A brief discussion ensued regarding research papers. Board members thanked the team for their efforts in developing the course to be successful and enjoyable for students. Vice Chairperson Deb Herbst also thanked Dr. Tremaglio for showcasing the good things that happen at Trumbull High and the Freshman Foundations course team for their efforts to bring this course to fruition.

- A. Approval/DECA Trip to Utah –Mrs. Owen noted that 6 students involved in the DECA Club placed high in the State competition and have been invited to attend the annual International Career Development Conference/Competition to be held in Salt Lake City, Utah from April 27 through May 2, 2012. A brief discussion ensued and it was noted that fundraising efforts were underway to subsidize the cost of the trip. It was moved (Ward) seconded (Chory) to approve the DECA Trip to Utah outlined with such approval contingent upon parent(s)/guardian signing a waiver relieving the school district of any financial obligations due to trip cancellations for any reason and with the stipulation that the Board can rescind it at anytime depending on the security situation. Vote: unanimous in favor.

At this time, it was moved (Labella) seconded (Chory) to take Agenda Item VI-A out of order. Vote: Unanimous in favor.

Agenda Item VI – Old Business (out of order)

A. Policy/Second Reading

1. Volunteers, Policy Code 1212.1—Dr. Cialfi conveyed that this policy came before the Board at their February 7, 2012 meeting. He noted Board and grammar changes were incorporated into the revision. It was moved (Chory) seconded (Seaman) to approve Volunteers, Policy Code 1212.1 as presented. Vote: Unanimous in favor.

At this time, it was moved (Labela) seconded (Seaman) to take Agenda Items IV-A and B out of order. Vote: Unanimous in favor.

Agenda Item IV—Reports (out of order)

A. Oral Reports

1. Teacher Board Representative Karen Rodrigues conveyed that the District is involved with CAPT and CMT testing, Trumbull High is still dealing with space issues due to construction, Frenchtown teacher Brenda Windsor received a National Teacher Award for Science, Tashua teacher Jennifer Neumeyer received a National Teacher Award for Mathematics, and Board members were invited to visit classes throughout the District.
2. Student Board Representative Emma Connolly reported that the Senior Showcase, a performing arts show, was very enjoyable, Trumbull High hockey team will play for the Division II State championship on Friday [March 16, 2012], and the Grade 9 “Truth about Hate” assembly, facilitated by Peer Leaders and moderated by the Anti Defamation League, was well received and over 40 students relayed their experiences with bullying to the audience. Superintendent Iassogna shared that 16 Peer Leaders with the assistance of Crises Intervention Specialist William Mecca and Assistant Dean of Students Dennis McLaughlin organized the assembly to foster a positive school climate; and students were surveyed after the program, citing that 98% felt it was the best assembly they ever attended. Several Board members expressed that they would like to have more detail and follow up discussion on the impact of this assembly on the agenda for a future Board meeting.
3. Student Board Representative Patrick Curtin noted that the jury outreach assembly for senior students taking the Political Systems course was very informative and tonight was a great evening for recognizing Trumbull High’s extracurricular academic activities.

Agenda Item I – Preliminary Business

- C. Correspondence – Mr. Kelly noted that the Board received several emails from parents in regards to the “Truth About Hate” assembly and in support of full/extended day kindergarten.
- D. Comments – There were no public comments this evening. At this time, Superintendent Iassogna reported that the Board of Finance approved the 3.47% increase for the Board of Education by a vote of 4-2 and noted that the Town budget now moves on to the Town Council with their vote to take place on April 9, 2012.

Agenda Item II -- Personnel

- A. Personnel – Superintendent Iassogna noted that one resignation was received that needed Board action. It was moved (Wright) seconded (Seaman) to accept the resignation of Nancy Mull, Grade 1 teacher since August 1992, retiring effective June 30, 2012. Vote: Unanimous in favor.

Agenda Item III – Consent Agenda

- A. Approval/Minutes – Regular Meeting – 2/28/12 By unanimous consent of members present at that meeting, the revised minutes (given to the Board before the meeting) were approved as presented.
- B. Approval/Financial Reports as of 2/29/12 – Mr. Sirico reviewed financial reports for the 8 months ended February 29, 2012. It was moved (Wright) seconded (Chory) to accept the Board of Education Expense Report for the 8 months ended 2/29/12 as presented. Vote: Unanimous in favor. It was moved (Chory) seconded (Ward) to accept the Grant Expense Report for the 8 months ended 2/29/12 as presented. Vote: Unanimous in favor. A question was raised about the deficit in the Education Jobs Fund account and Mr. Sirico conveyed that a transfer would be made. It was moved (Ward) seconded (Chory) to accept the Consolidated Financial Statement as of and for the 8 months ended 2/29/12 as presented. Vote: Unanimous in favor. It was moved (Ward) seconded (Chory) to accept the Board of Education Programs Detail Report as of 2/29/12 as presented. Vote: Unanimous in favor. Mr. Sirico reported that a new account “THS Trust” was established for the monies received from the Fred DeLuca Foundation to be used for the THS Scholarship Fund. A question was raised about available scholarship monies and it was noted that Guidance Counselor Alex Kovachi reviews all scholarship matters. It was moved (Ward) seconded (Chory) to accept the Expendable Trust Detail Report as of 2/29/12 as presented. Vote: Unanimous in favor. It was moved (Ward) seconded (Wright) to accept the Student Activity Detail Report as of 2/29/12 as presented. Vote: Unanimous in favor.

At this time, Mrs. Herbst asked the Superintendent to review State Education Department Commissioner Stefan Pryor’s visit to the District. Mr. Iassogna conveyed that Commissioner Pryor visited Trumbull on March 8, 2012. He toured the Trumbull Early Childhood Education Center and visited classes. The Commissioner also met with teachers and administrators to review the Governor’s education reforms and to listen to their concerns. Mr. Iassogna also noted that he was very impressed by Commissioner Pryor and felt that the Commissioner has a good understanding of education. The Superintendent also conveyed that the Board had the opportunity this evening to see what goes on outside of the classroom and the skills learned through the extracurricular academic activities. Mr. Kelly conveyed that in light of a request to name a soccer field after a former teacher, he would like a discussion on the naming of facilities/fields to be placed on a future agenda.
