Dear TPS Families and Staff:

Trumbull Public Schools is informing staff, parents, and guardians that a student or staff member at Middlebrook Elementary School and Tashua Elementary School have been diagnosed with coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19). At Middlebrook the person was on school premises on Friday, October 2 and did have direct exposure with other members of our community. At Tashua the person was on school premises beginning on Tuesday, September 29 and did have direct exposure with other members of our community. These are separate and distinct cases.

The district works closely with the Trumbull Nursing Department and Trumbull Health Department regarding each “case” and is following recommendations regarding quarantining, additional testing, or modifications to the school day. Based on these recommendations, Middlebrook Elementary School and Tashua Elementary School will remain **OPEN** during this time. We are working closely with the Trumbull Nursing Department and the Trumbull Health Department to identify anyone who had close contact with the person to determine if they might have been exposed to the virus that causes COVID-19. This is our highest priority when a positive case has been identified. If you or your child are identified as having been potentially exposed, you will receive an email to ask that you please stay home and monitor for symptoms of cough, shortness of breath, or a temperature higher than 100.4°F, and practice social distancing for 14 days from your last contact.

Please be sure that Middlebrook or Tashua has your correct phone number on file. To assist in contact tracing efforts to contain the spread of COVID-19, please answer any calls or texts from the following numbers:

If you are not contacted with a separate quarantine email then you do not need to stay home or exclude yourself from activities at this time.

Parents should continue to monitor their child’s health and the health of their families for [COVID-19 symptoms](#). Children with COVID-19 generally have mild, cold-like symptoms, such as fever, runny nose, and cough. Vomiting and diarrhea have also been reported in some children.

Children with certain underlying medical conditions, such as chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma, serious heart conditions, or weak immune systems, might be at higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19. Contact your child’s healthcare provider regarding any concerns.

Those who become ill should contact their healthcare provider. Their doctor, in consultation with public health officials, will determine appropriate care and whether testing is necessary. If your child has been exposed to or diagnosed with COVID-19, please report this to your school. This information will be kept confidential.

Schools continue to utilize Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommendations on [Reopening Guidance for Cleaning and Disinfecting Public Spaces](#), to reduce viral transmission and keep our children and school personnel healthy and safe. Parents and family members can assist this effort by promoting healthy behaviors and following these practices:

- **Stay home from school or work if sick, even if symptoms are mild.**
- Wear a face covering in areas where physical distancing is difficult to maintain.
- Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue (or sleeve), and then throw the tissue in the trash. Immediately wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for 20 seconds. If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60 percent alcohol.
- Avoid touching the eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Clean and disinfect surfaces that are often touched.
- **Avoid close contact with people who are sick.**
- Take care of your health overall. Stay current on your vaccinations, including the flu vaccine, eat well, and exercise to help your body stay resilient.


**We are working with the Health Department to keep our community safe.**
